Awarded a study grant from the German government through the Fulbright program, Mr. Berman continued his studies with Bernhard Ebert at the Hanover Music Conservatory in Germany, where he received the professional concert diploma in performance. Covering a wide range of repertoire with particular emphasis on rarely-played works and transcriptions, he has concertized extensively as recitalist and orchestral soloist at music festivals throughout Europe to great critical acclaim. His most recent release is a live recording featuring selections from two recitals containing works of Gershwin, Bach, Chopin, Infante, Medtner, and Liszt.

Maestro David Close is General Manager & Artistic Director of Musica Reginae Productions, Artistic Director and Conductor of The Oratorio Society of Queens, The Orchestral Arts Ensemble of Queens and the Orchestra of Musica Reginae. He has regularly toured with the Paul Whiteman Historic Aeolian Hall Concert and has conducted performances of the Singer's Theater of Westchester, the Manhattan Opera, and the New York Lyric Opera as well as having guest conducted Summer Sings for the New York Choral Society and the Masterwork Chorus of New Jersey.
